

Event Traffic Control Permit

A Street Use Permit is required when a county road is being used for purposes other than traffic flow.

Submittal requirements

The following information is required for a Street Use Permit:

- Applicant name and contact information-with e-mail. This will be the party responsible for the event. The permit will be issued to this person, neighborhood association, official committee, organization, business, etc.
- Fee. The permit fee is \$14.00 and can be paid by cash, check or VISA/MC.
- Reason for closure.
- Flyer used to advertise the event, if one is being used.
- Date, times, locations and approximate number of people attending.
- A written description of the route (or roads to be closed), along with a map with the proposed area shown. **The map should indicate where the road will be closed and detour routes.** Applicant may use MapQuest or a map book for the map. Neighbors must be able to access their homes.
- Proof of Insurance. The Certificate of Liability must show Clark County as the certificate holder and there must be a minimum of one million dollars in coverage. Applicant may contact their personal insurance agency or check the

internet for agencies specializing in one-day event insurance.

- Large community events, such as a parade, require an approved Traffic Control Plan from Clark County Public Works – Transportation. Applicant must also coordinate with the Sheriff's Office on the Traffic Control Plan.
- If any state-roads are used, applicant must obtain approval from Washington State Department of Transportation.

Prior to the event

- Applicant must arrange for use of barricades at their cost, if barricades are needed to close roads. Barricades must meet legal requirements. The applicant can contact American Barricade in Portland for barricade rental.
- Local newspapers, such as the Columbian, Reflector, etc., must be notified ten days in advance by applicant for large community events like parades.
- Forty-eight hours prior to the event applicant must contact Clark Regional Emergency Services Agency (CRESA) at (360) 737-1911 and the Clark County Sheriff's Office precinct the event will be held in. They must also notify neighbors in the affected area.

Additional considerations

When a Street Use Permit is used to close a road, Clark County's preference is to limit closures to side streets, dead ends or cul-de-sacs. All areas behind the blockage must have a detour to bypass the area.

Street Use Permit

Emergency vehicles must be able to access the area. Alcohol consumption, barbeques and live music are not allowed on the road in the closed area.

Submitting your information

A complete submittal packet is required prior to staff review. The required materials for large events must be submitted 60 days in advance. Small events such as block parties require submittal 15 business days prior to the event.

Applicants can submit materials by mail, fax or in person.
