Fire District #6 Lid Lift Information

Clark County Fire District 6 will ask voters to approve a levy lid lift to restore funding for emergency services. Call volumes have skyrocketed - 31.25% in 10 years, and 10% in the past year alone - as has the cost to provide emergency services. Firefighter training, medical care, replacing facilities, engines and equipment -these types of costs are out of our control, but represent real needs for our community. We've cut expenses by \$385,225, postponed vehicle and facility replacements, and have drawn down our reserve account from \$1.7 million to a low of \$250,000

- all to maintain emergency service levels.

Since 1995, Fire District 6's levy has fallen from \$1.50 to \$1.27 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation. "Lifting the lid" back to \$1.50 would restore revenue the fire district needs to fund daily operations, replace aging apparatus, make facility improvements, and improve firefighter safety and training without going into debt. The lid lift is estimated to cost the owner of a \$250,000 home an additional \$4.79 per month or \$57.50 per year. This amount would be sufficient to fund daily emergency operations and our reserve account to replace aging apparatus, make facilities improvements, and improve firefighter safety and training.

Abandoned Vehicles

Working with our neighbors on Abandoned Vehicle Issues, if the vehicle is on Public Property and has been in the same spot for more than 24 hours then contact the 911 center, by calling 693-3111 for Non-Emergency



calls and let them know that you would like to report an abandoned vehicle. Provide them with the location of the vehicle, the make and model if known, the color and most importantly the plate information. A deputy will come to the location of the vehicle and tag it for removal or if it is determined to be stolen then they will do their best to contact the registered owner to come and get the vehicle and if they are not able to reach the registered owner the vehicle will then be towed.

If the vehicle is on private property then it is up to the property owner to contact a tow company to have the vehicle removed.

Vehicles that have not moved in sometime in your neighborhood driveways or yards can be reported to Code Enforcement for review. Just Google - Code Enforcement Clark County and fill out the form.

SCHOOL BUS STOP RULES

A new school year is starting and many of our children will be riding the busses to and from school. The Washington State Patrol (WSP) would like you to take a few minutes to

refresh your knowledge on how to drive safely around school busses as they are picking up and dropping off our children.

The WSP has posted a video discussing rules of the road and driving safety around the school busses; when you have to stop and when may proceed. The School Bus Stop Rules video is posted at <http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=moK9MZVSIQY&feature=plcp>

The law states the \$394 fine for failure to stop for a school bus cannot be reduced, suspended, or waived. If you get a ticket for failure to stop for a school bus you will pay the full amount.

We cannot stress enough how important it is to practice safe driving, especially when children are present.

New Water Storage Tank

Clark County Public Utilities continue to make progress on the new, larger, 2.4 million gallon, welded steel water tower located at 6708 NE 14th Avenue. The water tank will be 80 ft. in diameter and will stand at a height of 76 ft. The same height as the present smaller half a million gallon water tower. The tank is being built to present earthquake standards and sits on an 1,100 cubic yard, reinforced slab of concrete (4 ft. thick at a diameter of 96 ft.). The water tower will be painted pale blue. Construction may continue into 2016 depending on weather conditions. The smaller water tower will remain on-line for the present until a complete evaluation can be completed.

Note that the truck was full of recycled tires. Right next to the station was the metal recycling and the bin was pretty much full, mostly with old propane BBQ's.

We learned at the event that Waste Connection Transfer Station occasionally pulls items off the garbage pile that are in good shape and still useable. Those items are donated and picked up by the SW Washington Humane Society to be sold in their retails store. Proceeds benefit the shelter animals. This is a great Win - Win situation.



LICENSE YOUR PETS ONLINE

Clark County pet owners can now more conveniently license their dogs and cats using a feature on the Animal Protection and Control website at www.clark.wa.gov/pets.

Pet owners can apply and pay for a new license or renew existing licenses after clicking on the green "pet licenses and renewals" button and setting up a personal account. Pets must be licensed on a yearly basis. The fine for an unlicensed pet is \$100.
