This is the county's oldest regional park, established in the 1930s. There are 154 rustic acres of forest and meadows bordering the East Fork of the Lewis River, with a 3-mile trail system meandering throughout the park. Activities abound, including swimming, fishing, picnicking, and horseshoes. There is one main baseball field and several play fields, playgrounds, and restrooms located throughout the park. There are 13 reservable log picnic shelters. Many picnic areas without shelters are available in a variety of locations within the park on first-come, first served basis. To reserve a picnic shelter, call 360-397-2285. For other information, phone 360-397-2285 ext. 1680.
