REQUEST: Consider enacting parking restrictions within the Regency Place Subdivision during the hours of 7 a.m. to 3 p.m., Monday through Friday, September through June, and any exceptions that may apply.

BACKGROUND The County has received numerous complaints from residents in the Regency Place Subdivision regarding students parking in the neighborhood rather than parking on campus at Union High School. Local residents requested a prohibition on parking during school hours. In advisory meetings with the County Commissioners, the Transportation Division was requested to ensure that residents in Regency Place Subdivision are not prevented from parking in front of their own homes.

The public roadways included in Regency Place Subdivision are further described as NE 5th and 6th Streets between NE 192nd Ave and the west boundary of Union High School (of Evergreen School District) and NE 193rd and 196th Avenues between NE 5th and NE 6th Streets and NE 194th Place north of NE 6th Street for approximately 250 feet.

The intent of the recommended parking restrictions is to strike a balance between necessary parking regulation and the reasonable use of the street for parking by the residents who live in the designated area.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH: Meetings were held with representatives from Union High School, the Vancouver Police Department and the homeowners in Regency Place Subdivision. Affected parties were notified of the hearing and hearing notices were posted in the neighborhood.




