Madore spoke on consent agenda item #1. He spoke about language from the Declaration of Independence and honoring history. Stewart spoke on consent agenda item #1. She stated the motto is not relevant to the duties she was elected to do. Further discussion ensued. Mielke stated it wasn't intended to be a religious symbol rather a national statement on how the government was formed. Further discussion ensued.

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Madore stated he would like the Board to be able to vote on this unanimously otherwise it appears the council is divided and could send the wrong message to the community.

ACTION: Moved by Madore to post the following language from the Declaration of the Independence in the hearing room / hallway: “We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness.--That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed.” Mielke seconded the motion. Stewart stated her concerns with offering a new proposal at this time. Mielke withdrew his motion.

Further discussion ensued about moving forward.

ACTION: Moved by Mielke to **APPROVE** consent agenda item #1. Motion died due to the lack of a second motion.

Stewart spoke about moving forward. Further discussion ensued.
